LEATHERNECK GOES 'ON-LINE'

Leatherneck magazine has gone electronic.

The glossy monthly magazine, which published its first issue 81 years ago, now can be accessed on the Internet at the Marine Corps Association's new website: www.mca-marines.org The site is called "Fire Base Leatherneck." The magazine has a diverse readership of 92,000, from junior enlisted Marines to veterans and retirees.

The Quantico, VA-based Marine Corps Association publishes the magazine along with the Marine Corps Gazette, a monthly journal for officers and staff noncommissioned officers.

Both magazines are represented on the website, which include samplings of articles and highlights in current issues and association membership information. Entire issues aren't available to view on-line, however. Site visitors will find a link to MCA publications, where they can access the catalog and other services. Marines Celebrate with a Quiet Protest

ARLINGTON, VA--Hundreds of former Marines--many crippled by old wounds, many coming from the far reaches of the country-celebrated the Marine Corps birthday in old fashion Nov. 10--they gathered at the Marine War Memorial for a protest.

It was a quiet protest, however. The veterans--encouraged by The Friends of Iwo Jima, a veterans group dedicated to preventing construction of an Air Force memorial near the Marine memorial--gathered in a show of solidarity against the Air Force's proposed

"I always enjoy coming to this memorial." said Sen. Charles Robb, the Guest of Honor.

Robb, a retired Marine Lieutenant Colonel, earned a Bronze Star medal during the Vietnam War.

"The lure of the Corps and this monument is hard to resist," he said.

Gen. Charles C. Krulak, Commandant of the Marine Corps, was also on hand to lay the traditional wreath at the base of the memorial. He also introduced the speakers and greeted the veterans.

Sweeney, mentioned the proposed Air Force memorial during their speeches.

Often referring to the memorial as "hallowed ground," Robb and Sweeney each spoke of the Marines who gave their lives in defense of the United States.

Sweeney, who commanded the Nagasaki bombing mission during World War II, thanked them for giving him a place to make an emergency landing after that fateful run.

"The only land that was around was Okinawa," Sweeney said. "If it hadn't been for taking that island...I would have been out in the ocean, swimming back still."

Robb spoke for the veterans in the audience

when he described the meaning of the memorial

"For us, this has become sacred ground," Robb said, drawing hearty cheers from the

"As long as we have a Marine Corps, as long as America remains the land of the free and the home of the brave, this memorial shall not be diminished."

He hinted that preserving the memorial's prominence is the least the country could do to show its appreciation to past and present

"They have never failed us and they never will," Robb said. "And we cannot fail them.
