A lot has happened since our last newsletter. The war in the Persian Gulf has reached a successful conclusion for the UN Forces, the PW's have been returned, and our troops will start to rotate home on a first in, first out basis.

The Marines, once again, distinguished themselves in their assigned battle location and provided yet another memorable chapter in the Leatherneck history book. This was emphasized at a briefing by Commander of Operations General H. Norman Schwarzkopf shortly after the start of the ground offensive. The text of his remarks is as follows:

At 4:00 in the morning, the Marines, the First Marine Division and the Second Marine Division, launched attacks through the barrier system. They were accompanied by the Second — the Tiger Brigade, U.S. Army Tiger Brigade of the Second Armored Division.

I can't say enough about the two Marine divisions. The — if I use words like *brilliant* it would really be an underdescription of the absolutely superb job that they did in breaching the so-called impenetrable barrier. It was a classic — absolutely classic military breaching of a very, very tough minefield-with-barbed-wire-fire-trenches type barrier. They went through the first barrier like it was water; they went across into the second barrier line.

Even though they were under artillery fire at the time, they continued to open up that breach, and then they brought both divisions streaming through that breach. Absolutely superb operation, a textbook [operation], and I think it will be studied for many, many years to come as the way to do it.

Sounds as if the Corps definitely did their homework and impacted a major offensive drive in the initial stage of the ground war. Another job..Well Done!

# Army's truck mystery is solved: See Marine recruiter for details

EASTERN SAUDI ARABIA - A couple of days ago, the U.S. Army conceded that 50 of its trucks had disappeared from a depot in Saudi Arabia, raising fears that they had been stolen by terrorists planning to use them to infiltrate American bases.

In response to the disappearances, sentries went on heightened alert at ing and is fought out in the halls of U.S. bases and the military police launched an investigation.

Well, forget the terrorists. Blame the Marines.

Yesterday, Maj. Gen. Robert Johnston told reporters that there had been a breakthrough in the investi-

Ten of the missing vehicles had been located, and most of the others apparently had been "borrowed" by the Marines.

Johnston, a Marine himself, offered no further details about the mystery, but the explanation may lie in two great American military tradi-

One is the ability of resourceful supply sergeants to cope with shortages by "borrowing" equipment from other units, even though everyone is supposedly fighting on the

The other explanation may lie in the great rivalry between the U.S. Army and the Marine Corps, a rivalry that is drummed into Army and Marine recruits during basic trainand American Legion and VFW Halls across the country.

And if the Army every gets those 35 trucks back, it better keep a tight guard on them. The Marines may want them back.

## Palau remembers World War II battles

World War II battles in the Pacific islands are still remembered vividly by many of the people who live there

The Republic of Palau, a U.S. Trust Territory southeast of the Philippines, has issued an attached block of four 45-cent stamps commemorating the participation of U.S. combat forces there during the

In 1944, the Palau Islands were designated as stepping stones for the attack on the Philippines led by Gen. Douglas MacArthur. Ground, sea and air forces were victorious in carrying out the battle

Depicted on the stamps are a U.S. B-24 bomber flying over Peleliu Island; a U.S. Navy LCI craft launching a rocket attack against the Japanese defending Peleliu; the U.S. 1st Marine Division attacking the Japanese on Peleliu; and Palauan children greeting an Army infantryman after the U.S. capture of the island chain in 1944.

Remnants of the war — disabled aircraft, sunken ships, crumbling military buildings, artillery pieces and even the bones of Japanese soldiers in caves — can still be found throughout the island.
