## Highlights

The regular meeting of the Central Bucks Detachment of the Marine Corps League of Pennsylvania, Inc., was held April 9, 1997, at Albert E. Atkinson American Legion Post #210, 315 North St., Doylestown, PA.

There were 23 members present including all officers except the Junior Vice Commandant and the Quartermaster. Distinguished Marines in attendance included Past Commandants Don Parzanese Sr., Budd Pearce, Bill Plant, and Frank Yohe; Department of New Jersey Past Commandant Ed Hoth; Department of Pennsylvania Southeast Division Vice Commandant Charlie Shaw; and, Marine of the Year Ray Krout. Members of the Central Bucks Unit of the Marine Corps League Auxiliary were also present.

The Minutes of the March Meeting were unanimously approved.

Paymaster Bob Cody issued the Paymaster's Report. The report was unanimously accepted.

The Commandant reported he had attended the Bucks County World War II Memorial Committee meeting and that the project was progressing. He reminded the membership the monument will be dedicated on Nov. 11, 1997. Brick subscriptions are moving briskly and, if anyone is interested in purchasing one of the memorial bricks, they need to submit their subscription as soon as possible.

**Senior Vice Commandant Bill Rosenberger** reported the Detachment membership strength was at 54 with 34 regular members, 6 associate members, 14 life members, and 8 delinquent members.

## INSURANCE HOAX SURFACES--AGAIN!

An insurance hoax that has returned time and again for more than 40 years to create administrative problems for the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has been revived by groups asking veterans to pay for assistance in collecting a nonexistent life insurance dividend.

"In the past,' said VA Secretary Jesse Brown, "the insurance hoax caused only administrative problems for VA. Now there are those who are trying to make a profit at the expense of veterans and we are resolved to stopping them. I have instructed the VA Inspector General to work with the Postal Service to do everything possible to put an end to this latest version of the hoax and to alert all veterans," the Secretary stated.

The VA Regional Office & Insurance Center on Wissahickon Ave., in Philadelphia, reports veterans and active duty military personnel throughout the country have received flyers, including return forms, from groups or individuals offering veterans assistance in applying for the dividends or in answering questions they may have for fees ranging from \$2 to \$15 for each request.

The flyers falsely claim that dividends for veterans' life insurance policies are available and payable to any veteran who applies. For veterans who served at least two years in the military, the flyer claims, the dividends range from \$264 for two years of service and increase for each additional year of service.

The phony applications and flyers, past and present, claim the dividends have been recently authorized by Congress. In fact, there is no such dividend for veterans who do not keep their insurance in force, nor a rebate for active duty personnel. No such legislation has been approved or proposed by Congress.

In the past, the hoax applications were unwittingly printed in magazines, newspapers and newsletters, or distributed in handbills.

The hoax has caused wasted efforts by thousands of veterans, active duty military personnel and dependents, and has generated needless labor and mailing expense by VA.

Legitimate insurance dividends are automatically paid, usually on the anniversary date of the policy, to approximately three million veterans with active policies in four GI life insurance programs. No application is needed to receive the dividend payment.

## Pennsylvania Veterans Memorial Seeking Funds

The Pennsylvania Veterans' Memorial at Indiantown Gap National Cemetery will cost \$3 million to construct.

Funds are being sought by the Pennsylvania Veterans' Memorial Trust Fund to complete the project.

The Pennsylvania Veterans' Memorial Commission will erect a memorial on the grounds of the Indiantown Gap National Cemetery in honor of all military veterans. Designs for the memorial were solicited and the final design by Charles J. Frederick Jr. of West Chester.

Frederick's design, entitled "The Ruins of A War Torn Building Centered in a Land of Solemnity," is functional and aesthetic. It is spacious, approximately 260 feet long by 85 feet wide, and will be capable of accommodating many activities. The Memorial's architecture is peaceful and harmonious. It contains the elements of air, land and water representative of the "battlefields" where our veterans fought for our freedom. A tomb for all soldiers, "known" and "unknown." is strategically located mindful of the sacrifices shared for the cause of freedom.

The amphitheater contains seating for large groups during any type of memorial service. The Memorial is to be a proper place within which one may offer devotion to those men and women who risked and sometimes gave their last full measure of devotion to our nation, our state and our way of life.

Each of us can become part of the effort to erect this long overdue Memorial. Tax-deductible donations can be made to: Pennsylvania Veterans' Memorial Trust Fund, Veterans' Memorial Commission, Building S-O-47, Ft. Indiantown Gap,

Annville, PA 17003-5002.

The Trust Fund is also offering inscribed granite bricks ranging in size from 9"x3" for \$100 to 36"x12" for \$1,000. A Gift Catalog, offering items from Memorial Pins to the \$1,000 bricks, is available from the Memorial Commission. 



He is also pursing making this a monthly event to further enrich the Detachment coffers.


