On Sunday, November 3, 1991, at 9 a.m., the sixteenth annual Marine Corps Marathon, "The People's Marathon", will take place in Washington, D.C. The 26-mile, 385-yard race will begin and end at the Marine Corps War Memorial in Arlington, Virginia. The course will wind through Arlington, Georgetown, and the District of Columbia. It passes many of the area's attractions, including the Capitol, the White House, the Jefferson and Lincoln Memorials, the Pentagon, the National Museums, and the Kennedy Center. It is a very beautiful route which has been appropriately nicknamed "The Marathon of the Monuments". Over 325 awards are presented for various catagories of the competition, and the winner is presented with the Middendorf Trophy.

The Central Bucks Detachment of the Marine Corps League is sponsoring a local runner in this premier event. He is fifty-two-year-old Dr. David Clayton, of Butler Avenue, New Britain, who, along with his twenty-five-year-old daughter Melissa, will be among the 13,000 entries. Dr. Clayton is a Clinical Psychologist employed by the Penn Foundation for Mental Health in Sellersville, PA. He competed on the track team in high school, but did not continue with any regular competition after graduation, until his fiftieth birthday. Since then, and for the last three years, he has been running consistently. He has run numerous 5 mile and 10 K races, as well as three entries in the Philadelphia Distance Run, which is a thirteen-mile race. To prepare for this race Dr. Clayton has been engaged in an eighteen-week training schedule of 5 or 6 days per week. By race time he will have logged 500 to 600 miles, with the bulk of the running split between Lake Galena in Bucks County and Ocean City, NJ.

Dr. Clayton stated that being sponsored by the local Marine Corps League Detachment has provided him with a much greater incentive to make a good showing in the race.

NOTE:

Dr. Clayton wasn't the front rummer; however, he finished in a respectable position. For his effort he received a handsome medallion, a T shirt and a commemorative patch. He commented that this was the best-organized Marathon he had ever seen or engaged in. All along the 26-mile course there were Marines supplying water bottles and shouting encouragement to the runners. Numerous bands, including the world-famous Marine Band, were in attendance. The last 380-plus yards to the finish line was at the Iwo Jima Memorial, which was very inspiring to him.

The Detachment wishes to thank Dr. Clayton for being our representative in this annual event.
