VAVS—The Detachment logged 49 volunteer hours since the last meeting. "Operation: STANDDOWN '96" will take place at Lighthouse Field in Philadelphia from Sept. 6-8. Detachment members Bill Plant, Wil Haas, and Bill Rosenberger are among those scheduled to participate in the three-day program which feeds, clothes, houses, and provides treatment and counseling to homeless veterans in the Philadelphia metropolitan area. Gen. Mundy Joins USO

Retired Gen. Carl E. Mundy Jr., former Commandant of the Marine Corps, is the new president and chief executive officer of the USO.

The USO headquarters is in Washington, DC, and it has more than 170 centers around the world. The organization provides programs to help service members cope with being away from home. The USO board of governors elected Mundy to the paid position.

He will continue to serve on boards of directors of the Schering-Plough Pharmaceutical Corp.; the NationsFund family of mutal funds; the Marine Corps Command and Staff Foundation; the Fisher House Foundation; the board of advisors to the board of visitors of The Citadel; and the board of advisors to the board of directors of the Navy League of the United States.

# **OSPREYS TESTED IN EXERCISE**

Two developmental versions of the V-22 Osprey tiltrotor aircraft took part in a Marine Corps exercise recently at Camp Lejeune, NC, to demonstrate the aircraft's capabilities to foreign military leaders, Marine and defense industry sources said.

Two V-22's flew more than three hours from their testing facility at Patuxent River, MD, to North Carolina, where they engaged in low-level flying at speeds of 200 knots, converted to helicopter mode and landed for inspection, Marine sources said

Attending the exercise were Marine Corps commandants from Great Britain, the Netherlands, Spain and Portugal.

# Clinton Approves Awarding of Bronze 'M' Device to Reservists

A decoration established in 1933 to honor reservists who go on active duty in support of a military operation can now be authorized and worn.

President Bill Clinton signed an Executive Order Aug. 8 authorizing the award of the bronze "M" mobilization device to U.S. reserve component members who have "performed qualifying active-duty service in support of a designated contingency operation on or after Aug. 1, 1990," according to Pentagon officials.

"This device recognizes the sacrifice of our National Guard and Reserve people who are mobilized as part of the Total Force," said **Defense Secretary William J. Perry**.

According to the Executive Order, the "M" decoration will be worn on the Armed Forces Reserve Medal.

A ceremony is being planned to recognize "a representative group of reserve component members" by awarding them the medal, a Pentagon spokesman said.

Those now eligible for the award are nearly 3,000 National Guard and Reserve members who participated in one of the designated operations.

The operations include the Persian Gulf War, Operation Restore Hope (Somalia), Operation Uphold Democracy (Haiti), and Operation Joint Endeavor (Bosnia), said Pentagon officials.

The device also will be worn with existing bronze, silver and gold hourglass devices designating 10, 20 and 30 years of reserve service.

The "M" can also be worn in conjunction with an Arabic numeral indicating the number of times it has been awarded to a member.

The "M" device was established three years ago.

# 'BENNIES' BOOK NOW AVAILABLE FROM G.P.O.

One of the federal government's alltime best-selling publications, Federal Benefits for Veterans and Dependents, has been updated for 1996 and is now available from the U.S. Government Printing Office.

Published by the Department of Veterans Affairs, the 98-page handbook describes federal benefits for veterans and dependents such as medical care, education, disability compensation, pension, life insurance, home loan guaranty, vocational rehabilitation, and burial assistance. It also explains eligibility requirements for the different benefits and outlines claim procedures.

Addresses and phone numbers—including the number to reach the nearest benefits counselor: 1-800-827-100— of all VA offices, medical centers, national cemeteries, Vietnam veteran counseling centers, and other VA facilities are listed by state.

The handbook, which sells for \$3.25, also includes the latest information on benefits for Persian Gulf veterans, homeless veterans and women veterans and contains special sections on veterans benefits administered by other departments including Defense and Labor.

Federal Benefits for Veterans and Dependents ranks third in total sales of publications by the U.S. Government Printing Office. Including the 1995 edition, more than 2,800,000 copies had been sold through January.

The handbook is available postpaid from the Superintendent of Documents, P.O. Box 371954, Pittsburgh, PA 15220-7954. The G.P.O. stock number for th booklet is 051-000-00209-1 and can be purchased by check or credit card. To order with your VISA or MasterCard, call (202) 512-1800. 


