VA Federal "Benny" Book Available

One of the federal government's alltime best-selling publications, "Federal Benefits for Veterans and Dependents," has been updated for 1998 and is now available from the U.S. Government Printing Office.

Published by the Department of veterans Affairs (VA), the 96-page handbook describes federal benefits for veterans and dependents such as medical care, education, disability compensation, pension, life insurance, home loan guaranty, vocational rehabilitation, and burial assistance.

It also explains eligibility requirements for the different benefits and outlines claims procedures.

The handbook, which sells for \$3.75, VISA, Discassion includes the latest information on 512-1800.

benefits for Persian Gulf veterans, homeless veterans and women veterans and contains special sections on veterans benefits administered by other departments including Defense and Labor.

Federal Benefits for Veterans and Dependents ranks third in total sales of publications by the U.S. Government Printing Office. Including the 1997 edition, more than 3,200,000 copies have been sold.

Monuments to Honor D.I.s Planned

SAN DIEGO, CA--The Marine Corps Drill Instructors Association is a nonprofit association operating under section 501(c)(19) of the Internal Revenue Code since April 1986.

One of our first orders of business, when we began operations, was to honor all individuals who have or are now training the future of our Corps.

Since then, we have been working on a monument to be placed at each Recruit Depot to do just that. This has been a long and enduring project; at last we can see the end. It is our hope that both monuments will be in place and dedicated this Fall.

The monuments will be placed in a 40'x40' square. At the monument you will see two bronze statues approximately six feet tall, standing on a 20'x30' granite slab. The background will be a 5'x7' granite slab with our logo in brass and the "Drill Instructors Creed" etched in gold with the Marine Corps emblem at the bottom.

There will be a walkway around the monuments with brass footprints in the center. There you may "report" or just reminisce. Bricks with the names of all who purchase or want to purchase a brick with their own wording will be laid in

front of both monuments. Once these are completed and dedicated they will be given to the Recruit Depots.

We chose Mr. John Chalk of "War and Peace, Inc." in Pottstown, PA, to sculpt the statues. John is a former Marine and has been working on this project for more than a year.

The statues will be fired and bronzed at Laran Fine Arts Foundry in Chester, PA. All granite work will be done by Chapel Rose Quarries in Elberton, GA, and shipped to each site.

Anyone who has been there as a Marine or civilian or maybe you would like to place a brick in remembrance of a loved one. You do not have to have been a Drill Instructor to participate. It is open to anyone.

Congress Loosens VA Healthcare Regulations

Congress recently moved to open the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) health care to more of this country's veterans. The Senate Veterans Affairs Committee approved by voice vote, a draft bill designed to loosen rules for those who seek VA outpatient care. Within a week, the House voted 416-0 to pass HR 3118, legislation similar to the Senate bill.

Under the provisions of both bills, they would cap VA health care appropriations at \$17 billion in FY 1999. VA would also set up a new priority system for treating veterans, with service-connected disabled veterans continuing to receive top priority and other categories of veterans receiving care as the budget allowed. Further,

VA would be given greater flexibility to treat veterans through outpatient care and by contracting services to the private sector. Veterans currently receiving priority care would be unaffected. They include service-connected disabled and indigent veterans, and veterans suffering from catastrophic illnesses. In addition, former prisoners of war and World War I veterans would be added.

While these bills together comprise an initial phase for VAhealth care reform, veterans groups are concerned about the impact these changes will have on services and treatment of priority category "C" veterans seeking VA health care. Supporters claim these changes will allow VA to treat veterans for less money and then be able to use the savings to expand treatment for veterans.


